Just south-east of Williamsburg is a community known locally as Windsor Valley. You won't find it, as such, on any local or state maps. It is named for the family that has lived there since the mid-1800s.

The legacy of Windsor Valley began when Sarah Ellen, the daughter of Henry Wadsworth Viers, married Alfred Reece Windsor. Together they had a family of 13 children. The twins Clifford and Clarence were born in 1885.

Clifford married Idabel Love at her home on May 20, 1909. Together they had a family of seven children. After a year of being away they returned to run the family farm.

Of the seven children born to Clifford and Ida (four sons and three daughters), all of the sons and one daughter bought land adjoining the homestead.

The sons became successful farmers and helped each other get started by sharing both physical labor, use of machinery, and financial aid.

Presently, nine Windsor families live full-time on the Windsor Valley acreage. Recently a family member said (as he topped the hill by Rea Windsor's house), "I never get tired of looking at this place!"

Niki (Windsor), Blacklock had an antique shop called Windsor Antiques located here in Marlene's Restaurant, for several years before retiring.

It will hopefully be a peaceful and beautiful home for Windsor families for years to come.

Conservation News

Instead of doing Joe's Corner this month we are placing an article from the Conservation Department. We will continue with Joe's Corner next month.

This September brought another successful Youth Dove Clinic & Hunt to the Williamsburg area. Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) staff, sponsors and volunteers hosted the event with 35 youth ages 8-15 participating in the evening clinic. Youth had the opportunity to hear from conservation agents about hunting safety, wildlife biologists about dove management, the opportunity to practice clay bird shooting with mentors, and a free evening meal. The morning youth hunt saw over 200 birds taken with 10 youth able to limit out at 15 doves. Another very successful year thanks to MDC, participants and sponsors and the National Wild Turkey Federation for providing the grant funding for this special event.

If you know of a youth between 8-15 years of age who may be interested in this event keep us in mind for next year. Please contact the Whetstone Creek Conservation Area office next summer for registration 573-254-3330. The event is free and youth participants do not need to be Hunter Ed Certified.

Refrigerator Mashed Potatoes

- 9 Large Baking Potatoes
- 1 6oz pkg Cream Cheese
- 1 Cup Sour Cream
- 2 Tsp Onion Salt
- 1 Tsp Salt
- 1/4 Tsp Pepper
- 2 Tbsp Butter

Peel and cook potatoes in salted water. Mash using butter. Add rest of ingredients and continue mashing. Store in refrigerator up to two weeks. Top with butter and reheat in oven (350 degrees) about 30 minutes or until heated through.

I use about another 2 Tbsp of butter to spot around the top before baking. Marlene
